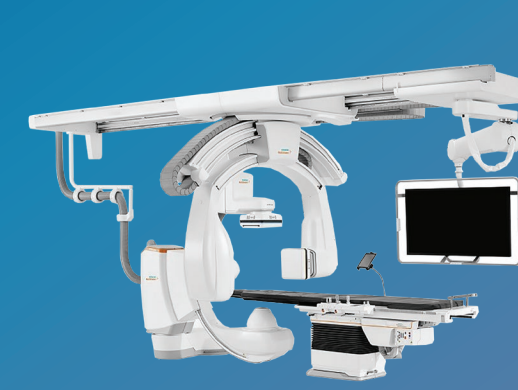
We are so proud of the medical equipment purchases the Foundation was able to make for Community Memorial Hospital with your support last year.



The LUCAS Chest Compression System provides ideal CPR, leaving healthcare providers' hands free for other life-saving tasks. Delivering compressions at a consistent rate and depth, this unit is portable enough to transport patients with uninterrupted care.



An MRI-safe stretcher/gurney is a non-magnetic transport unit designed to convey a patient to their MRI or other imaging procedure safely. These units feature generous weight capacity, a storage tray below, and flip down side rails to provide easy accessibility and ease of care.



Used for neurosurgery, biplane imaging is one of the most advanced interventional medical imaging technologies available. The two rotating cameras produce highly detailed images of blood vessels, soft tissue, and blood flow in real time.



A portable digital X-ray machine in the Emergency Department allows multiple patients to be treated more efficiently, right at the bedside, providing accurate and timely results.



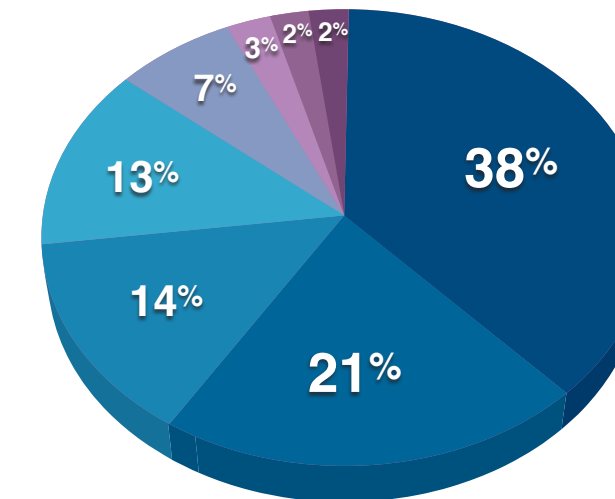

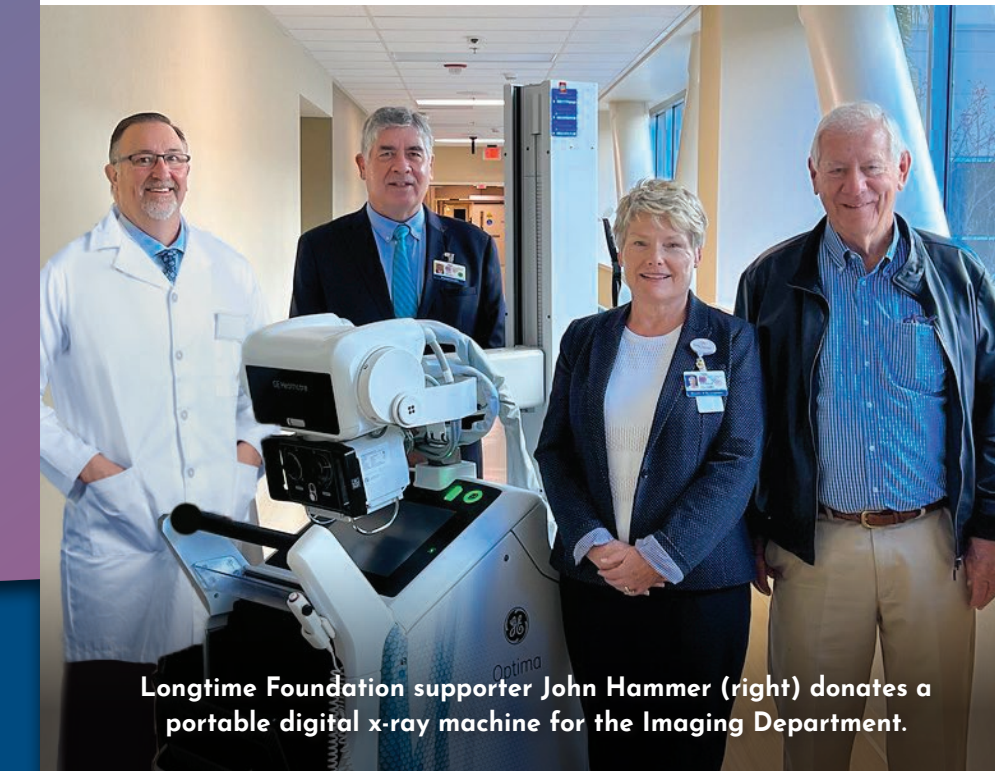

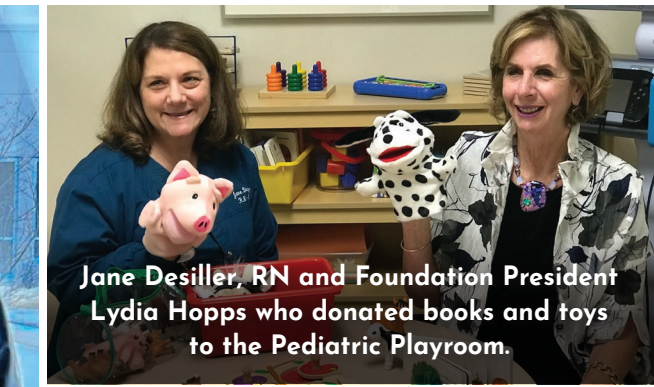
